Detailed description of the event

They say that necessity is the mother of invention. Over the years, Fountain Inn has struggled to find an opportunity to provide a safe and fun way for families to trick or treat with our Main Street merchants. As the self-proclaimed “Jeep Capitol” of South Carolina, we decided that the best way would be to host a Halloween themed Jeep Trunk or Treat event on Main Street called Jeepers Creepers! Planning began in June for an October 28 event date. Planning events is always difficult, but that difficulty is compounded when it’s a new event and you don’t know what to expect. As with any event, promotion is key. Posters needed to be designed, social media posts needed to be made, and applications developed. After some brainstorming and many iterations, we settled on a logo and poster that showed a family of friendly skeletons driving down our historic Main Street in high contrast autumn colors. Fonts were chosen to be easy to read and the shadows on the letters gave it a somewhat spooky feel. A promotional video was made to further draw interest to our event. A classic black and white horror film clip with our logo and info overlaid. That video created quite a buzz and was viewed over 5000 times! We knew that with a Halloween Theme, we had a great opportunity to be creative with our marketing. Skeletons were strategically placed on benches along Main Street for folks to take pictures with our frightening friends. With names like Scary Potter, Captain Jack Marrow, and Mr. Bone-Jangles, they were the perfect Jeepers Creepers Ambassadors! Transforming the feel of the environment is key to the success of any event...especially those with specific themes. Storefronts were decorated, jack-o-lanterns were hung in the trees, and our streetscape lights were changed from white to green, yellow, and orange for the event, truly changing Fountain Inn into Halloweentown! A Jeep Cruise In only works if you have Jeeps. We needed to reach out to the local Jeep Clubs to get the word out. As soon as we contacted those clubs, we knew we had a hit because the applications started coming in immediately. We anticipated 75+/- Jeeps, but within two weeks of contacting the Jeep Clubs, we were at 200 Jeeps, and we had to cap attendance there. Figuring out where to place 200 Jeeps in our small town was a pretty big problem, but it was a good problem to have. As soon as we realized the size of the monster we had created, we made the decision to extend our event to include more of our Main Street district. With a footprint covering 4 blocks of Main Street and the associated side streets including Commerce Park, we knew we had to include other ancillary events. A 200 ft. hay maze was designed and built in front of our local brewery, VooDoo Brewing. 300 pumpkins were brought into our Farmers Market Pavilion for kids to paint their scariest (or friendliest) faces on. Inflatable games kept the kiddos busy while parents enjoyed beverages from The Fountain Inn Tap Room, VooDoo Brewing, and Cucina 100. Local favorite, The Vinyl Junkies took the Commerce Park Stage at 6:30 and rocked the house until 9:00. With a music list that spans 10 decades they tailored the music to fit the vibe of Jeepers Creepers and the Halloween season. Through inventive arrangements, danceable grooves, and songs we had not heard other bands play, they kept the audience of all ages involved and moving! The day of the event, we began placing Jeeps of various models and sizes along Main Street with the help of our new Jeep Club friends around 4 pm. By the time the event began at 6pm, we were already in full swing with families taking in the sights. Each Jeep was decorated differently. Many had movie themes like Ghostbusters or Beetlejuice, some were decked out with ghosts and goblins, but all had plenty of candy. All in all, we estimate over 50,000 pieces of candy were given to the kiddos that night.

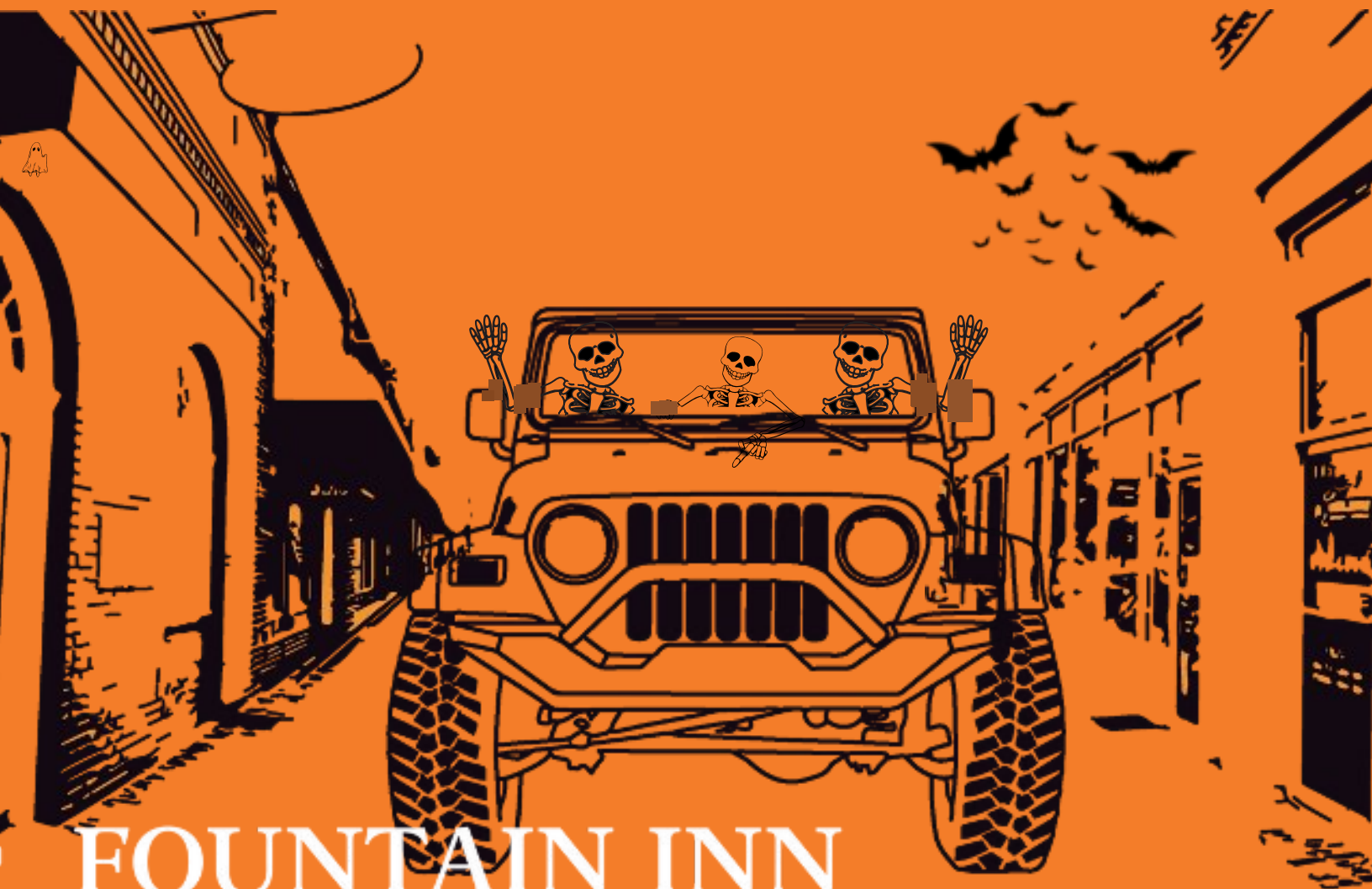

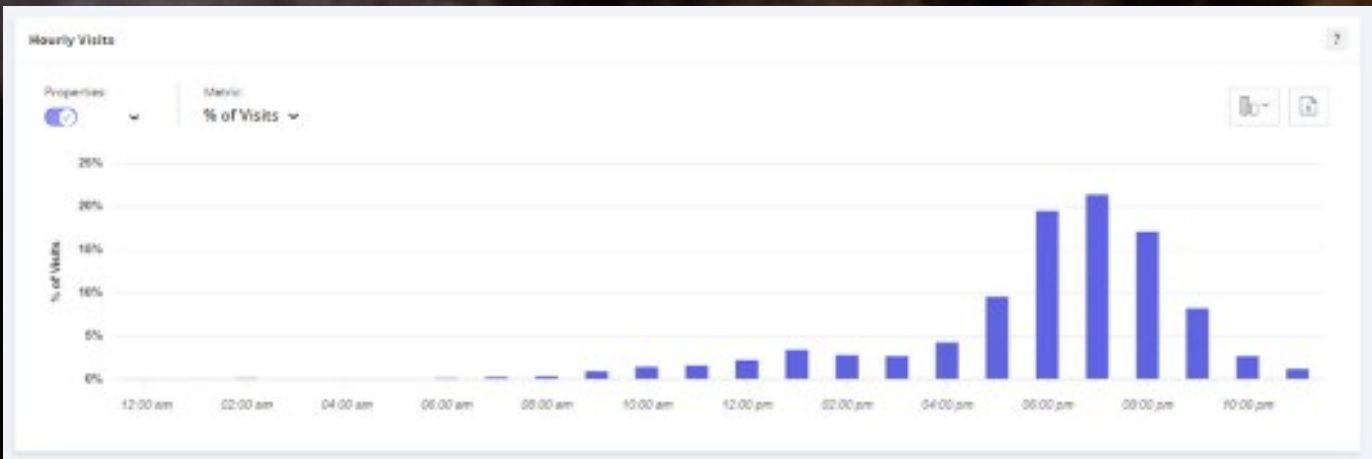
HOW DID THE IDEA COME TO BE?

She was attacked because of pandemic concerns over her Jeep. Later during that visit, she purchased a bag of small rubber ducks with the intention to leave them around the house for friends and family to find. As she left the store, she found a Jeep jockey who wrote, "Nice Jeep - Have A Great Day!" on a duck and left it for the owner to find. #DuckDuckJeep was born that day for no other reason than to spread joy and fun across the Jeep community. Duck Duck Jeep pages have been set up in over 40 countries and every state. The #DuckDuckJeep hashtag has over a million posts across several platforms and continues to be a positive way to interact with Jeep owners.

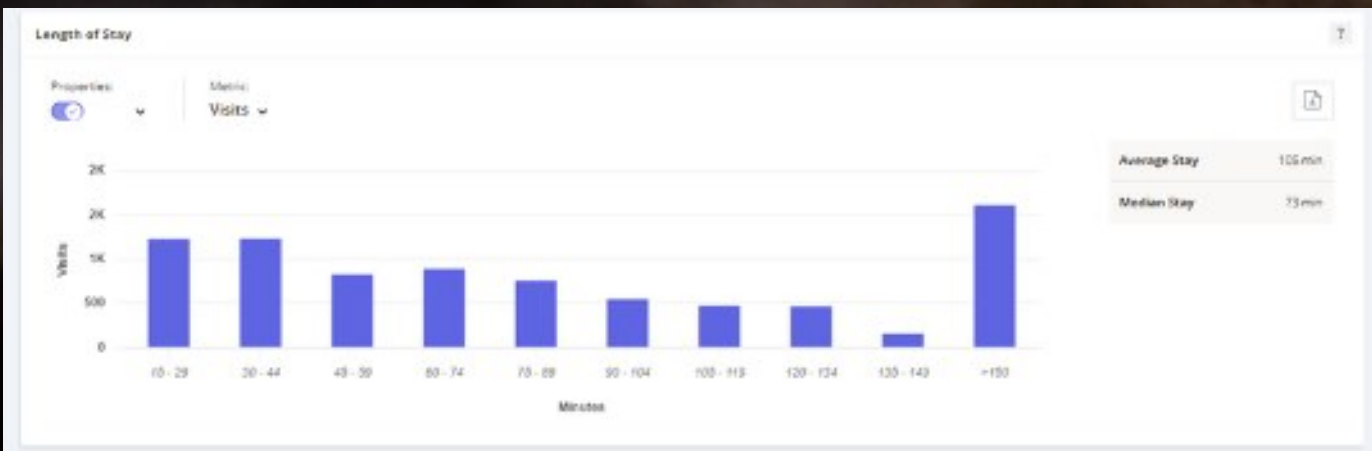

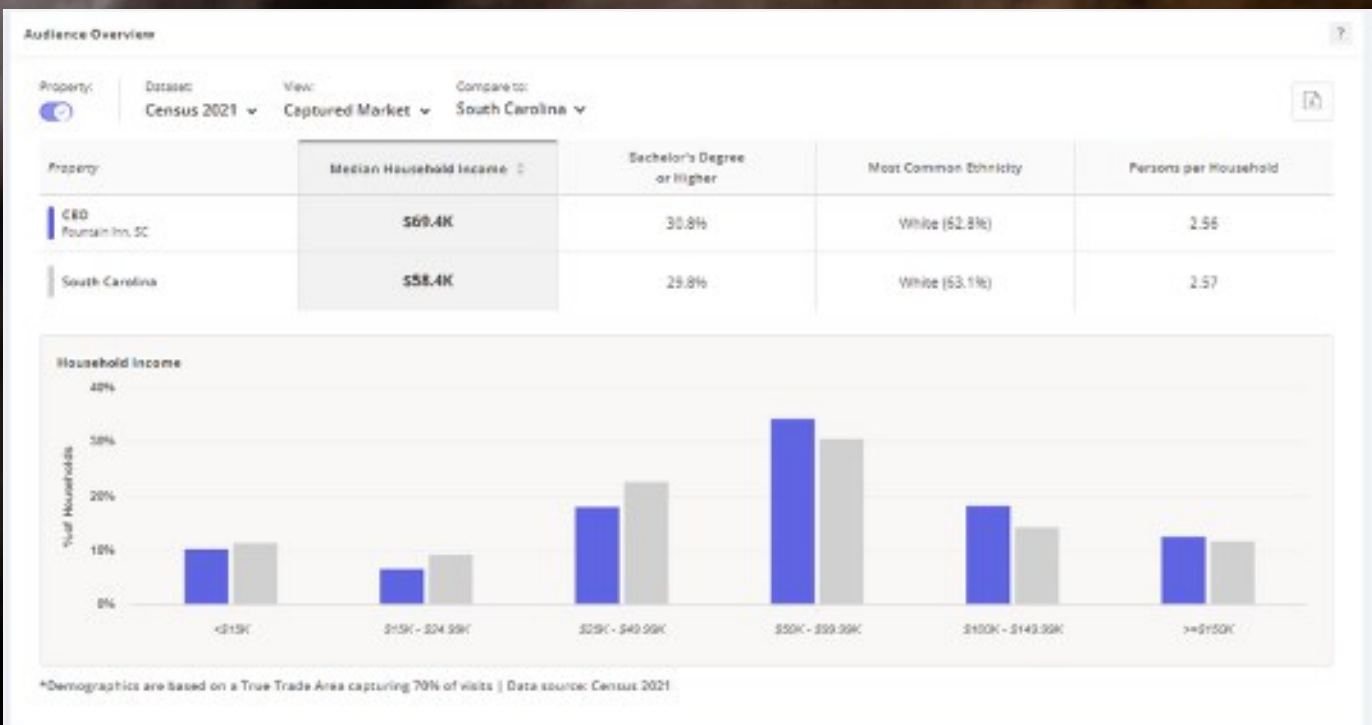

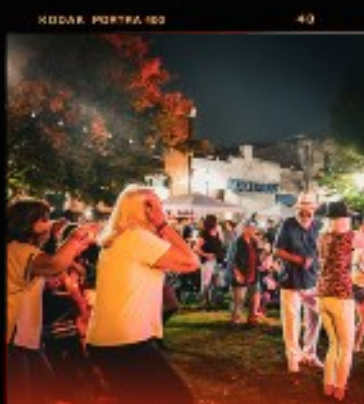
