HOW CAN AI HELP ME WITH EVENTS?

- This is only as good as the information you provide.
- It is NOT a mind reader.
- It is an idea generator that can move you in a direction.
- It is still early and many of these programs will probably end up in existing programs we use.
- Text prompts do not generate feelings so it can't read your "gut"
- This is sometimes to get the ball rolling and you have to pick up the ball and "throw" it again.
